SINGULAR AND PLURAL RULES –

Singular Noun Definition: When a noun means one only, it is said to be singular.

Examples: boy, girl, book, church, box

Plural Noun Definition: When a noun means more than one, it is said to be plural.

Examples: boys, girls, books, churches

RULE #1

The plural of nouns is usually formed by adding -s – to a singular noun.

lamp	lamps	cat	cats
fork	forks	flower	flowers
pen	pens	car	cars

Most nouns ending in $-\mathbf{o}$ – preceded by a consonant is formed into a plural by adding – **es**.

Examples:

hero heroes grotto grottoes

RULE #7

Some nouns ending in $-\mathbf{f} - \text{or} - \mathbf{fe}$ – are made plural by changing the $-\mathbf{f}$ – or the $-\mathbf{fe}$ – to $-\mathbf{ves}$.

Examples:

leaf	leaves	wife	wives



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calf	self	sheaf	life
loaf	shelf	half	wolf
thief	scarf	knife	strife

I like that pencil.	I like those pencils.
